Summary

Production chefs work as part of a team in time-bound and often challenging kitchen environments, example; for schools, hospitals, the Armed Forces, care homes and high street casual dining or pub kitchens. They report to the Senior Production chef or appropriate line manager. Production chefs / line chefs to work with likely centrally standardised developed recipes menus, producing food often in high volumes. They apply highly methodical organisational skills, energy, accuracy, attention to detail and are mindful of the importance of sustainability and protecting the environment . Employers will be committed to practically train the apprentice within the workplace setting.

Entry Criteria

We would expect apprentices to ideally have achieved level 1 qualifications in English and Maths

Apprentices will attend college one day a week (during term-time only) at our Kingsway College Campus

What will I learn?

A Production Chef will learn to:

- maintain excellent standards of personal, food and kitchen hygiene
- ensure compliance to procedures, menu specifications and recipes.
- produce food meeting portion controls, and budgetary constraints
- adapting and produce dishes to meet special dietary, religious and allergenic requirements
- follow, complete and maintain production schedules, legislative and quality standard documentation
- use specialist kitchen-equipment
- communicate internally and externally with customers and colleagues
- commit to personal development activities
