WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP



An apprenticeship is a paid full time or part time job where the employee learns and gains valuable experiences.

Alongside on-the-job training, apprentices spend at least 20% of their working hours completing classroom-based learning with a college, university or training provider which leads to a nationally recognised qualification.

An apprenticeship includes:

- Paid employment with holiday leave
- Hands-on-experience in a sector/role of interest
- At least 20% off-the-job training
- Formal assessment which leads to a nationally recognised qualification



APPRENTICESHIP vs UNIVERSITY



An apprenticeship is funded by your employer, a way to earn and learn, and gives you practical, on-the-job experience. A university degree involves paying tuition fees, purely academic study, and attendance of seminars and lectures.

Apprenticeships -

- Employed while learning a qualification
- Earning a Salary
- Qualification is free to yourself
- Hands on experience

University -

- Each academic year costs £9,250
- No income unless employed
- Attend seminars and lectures
- Limited hands-on experience
- Potentially move away from home



WHO CAN APPLY



An apprenticeship is a great paid work opportunity for people **over the age of**16 in England who are:

- Early in their career
- Looking to upskill in their current job
- Looking for a career-change
- Not in full-time education

There is no maximum age to be an apprentice.



APPRENTICESHIP LEVELS



An apprenticeship can start at any level, but some may require:

- Previous qualifications such as English or Maths GCSEs
- Additional training in English or Maths to ensure the apprentice is at the right level

Intermediate – Level 2 – GCSE

Advanced – Level 3 – A Level

Higher – Level 4, 5, 6, and 7 – Foundation Degree and Above

Degree – Level 6 and 7 – Bachelor's and Master's Degree



OFF-THE-JOB TRAINING



In England, it is a statutory requirement for an apprentice to spend 20% of their paid time 'off-the-job'. This involves essential training to help the apprentice gain the skills needed to complete their apprenticeship.

Off-the-job training is delivered by subject experts and can include:

- Teaching theory (e.g. classroom lessons, lectures and online learning)
- Practical training (e.g. shadowing, mentoring, industry visits)
- Learning support and time to write assignments

The training can take place in or out of the work environment. Some employers will offer in-house training, others may work with colleges, universities and training providers to deliver the training for them.



APPRENTICE MINIMUM WAGE



The current minimum wage for an Apprentice –

Current wage is £5.28 per hour, rising in April 2024 to £6.40 per hour.

Some companies will offer a lot higher than the minimum apprenticeship wage but not all companies have the ability to do so. It may be about finding the correct opportunity.

The NHS Apprenticeship starting salary this year is £22,816 per year.


