Maths and English are subjects that are just as important as your son/daughter's vocational course, as they can lead to many a beneficial outcome: **employment**, **apprenticeships**, **university**, **internal progression**, **even just a confidence boost!**

The maths and English team work hard to reinforce this positive message with students throughout the year, and so it is important that this continues beyond their time spent in college.

- For maths and English, there are two types of course offered at the college: **GCSE and Functional Skills**
- If any student-new or returning-does not have a C or 4 in GCSE English Language, they are required to study maths/English in either of these forms until the end of the academic year as a condition of the funding of their main vocational course
- The maths/English qualification that a student studies depends on their highest grade achievement in the subject

The Pre-Advanced maths and English department ethos:

The team provide expert support and guidance in order to develop your son/daughter's maths and English skills further through high quality teaching and learning.

- If your son/daughter is studying GCSE, they will be sitting a 2-year qualification in 10 months. This means that the next 10 months will require **hard work** and **dedication** from the start. The following pages give details of resources your son/daughter can use to make the most of this time
- Students will no longer be awarded A*-G but instead will be awarded according to the new 9-1 grading system, with 9 being the highest grade
- Students must achieve a **grade 4 or higher** to pass. This is the equivalent to the *'old'* grade C







GCSE English

• There are **no controlled assessments.** Students will sit two exam papers, with dates set by the exam board. The provisional dates for the exams are below. Please be aware that these could change slightly between now and October. Can you please ensure that holidays are **NOT** booked for these dates as your son/daughter has no chance of passing unless they sit both exams

Paper 1: Tuesday 5th June 2018 at 9.00am Paper 2: Friday 8th June 2018 at 9.00am

- Each exam paper is 1 hour 45 mins long
- There are no tiered papers. Students can therefore potentially achieve any grade between 9 and 1



- Students will take a separate speaking and listening assessment during the year, and will be awarded Pass, Merit or Distinction. This does not count towards the 9-1 grade for the exams taken in June
- The reading sections of the exams will be based on fiction (e.g. extracts from novels or short stories) and non-fiction (e.g. articles) from the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries across the two papers
- Students will cover each paper question by question in the form of units. They will then sit a mini assessment for each unit/question so that they can see which skills they need to work on

GCSE maths

• Students will sit **three** exam papers, with dates set by the exam board. The provisional dates for the exams are below. Please be aware that these could change slightly between now and October. Can you please ensure that holidays are **NOT** booked for these dates as your son/daughter has no chance of passing unless they sit all three exams

Paper 1: Thursday 24th May 2018 at 9.00am Paper 2: Thursday 7th June 2018 at 9.00am Paper 3: Thursday 12th June 2018 at 9am




- Each exam paper is 1 hour 30 mins long
- Your son/daughter will be sitting the foundation paper this year in college. Students can therefore potentially achieve any grade between 5 and 1
- Students will cover each paper question by question in the form of units. They will then sit a mini assessment for each unit/question so that they can see which skills they need to work on







New GCSE grading structure



Your son/daughter will have to work hard to be successful on their GCSE maths/English course this year. We would expect your son/daughter to maintain at least 95% attendance and complete **a minimum of 1 hour work outside the classroom per week.** This could be homework or directed study provided by their tutor or practice/revision using the various resources available online (recommended websites listed below). Your son/daughter may also be invited to attend revision or booster classes as the main exams draw near. This is all vital to ensuring that students have covered, practised and revised everything necessary to maximise their potential and achieve the best possible results.

Functional Skills: English and maths

- Four different levels: entry level 1, entry level 2, entry level 3, level 1 (the highest)
- The exam board is Edexcel/Pearson
- ENGLISH: Students sit 3 exams: reading exam, writing exam and speaking and listening assessment.
 They must pass all three to gain a certificate and therefore progress to the next level the following year
- MATHS: students sit 1 exam
- Exams are taken throughout the year and dates are set by the tutor
- Provides an excellent foundation for GCSE; once a student has achieved level 1, they move on to GCSE the following year
