Leader in Adult Care Apprenticeship

Summary

Commencing an apprenticeship within the Health and Social Care industry will provide you with the opportunity to gain significant job-satisfaction from the positive impact that you are having on your community. As a leader in adult care, you will guide and inspire teams to make positive differences to someone's life when they are faced with physical, practical, social, emotional, psychological or intellectual challenges. The aim of the Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Adult Care is to guide and assess the knowledge and skills relating to leadership and management within adult care. Learners undertaking this qualification have to work in a managerial role from a variety of adult care settings.

Entry Criteria

There is no formal entry criteria for this apprenticeship however we would expect to see:

- Apprentices at this level need to have achieved Maths and English level 2 or be able to demonstrate an ability work to work towards
- It is recommended that they hold a Level 3 or above qualification in a related area.
- The apprentice will need to be at least 19 years of age.
- Apprentices will need to undertake the Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service process and provide the result prior to starting.
- Apprentices at this level will have to work in a managerial role from a variety of adult care settings.

What will I learn?

As part of your apprenticeship, 20% of your time will be spent doing 'off the job' training. Training will include:

- Tasks: lead and support others to work in a person-centred way, sustain quality and ensure duty of care is upheld.
- Dignity and human rights: legislation/policy initiatives on the promotion of equality and diversity.
- Communication: Develop process which establish legal and ethical frameworks in relation to confidentiality.
- Safeguarding: implement legislation, national and local solutions for the safeguarding of adults/children and create a culture that supports whistleblowing.
- Health and wellbeing: lead the implementation of policies and procedures to manage health and mitigate risk.
- Professional Development: research current drivers in adult care and embed systems to improve performance.
- Leadership: modelling a values-based culture.
